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# THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

The feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary will be celebrated on Saturday the 17<sup>th</sup> June. Because the Immaculate Heart of Mary is our patron, it is a solemnity for our parish. A solemnity is a feast day of the highest rank. The Immaculate Heart of Mary is a devotion that honours the heart of Mary who was pure and immaculate and a model of holiness. She was chosen by God to be the mother of our saviour Jesus. The devotion provides a way for us to unite ourselves to God through Mary's extraordinary love for her son Jesus. Because she was sinless, she is able to love God perfectly.

The origins of the devotion can be traced back to the Middle Ages, but it was not until the 17th century that it began to gain popularity. In 1648, Saint John Eudes, a French priest, established the first congregation dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. He also wrote extensively about the devotion and encouraged others to promote it. In the 19th century, the devotion gained even more popularity due to the visions of Saint Catherine Labouré, a French nun. Catherine received a vision of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, surrounded by rays of light and encircled by the words "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." This vision became the basis for the Miraculous Medal, a medal that bears the image of the Immaculate Heart of Mary on one side and the image of Saint Catherine on the other. In the early



20th century, the devotion was further promoted by the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal. In 1917, three young shepherd children received messages from Mary, urging people to pray for peace and to make sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. Mary also revealed her Immaculate Heart to the children and asked that the world be consecrated to it.

Today, the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary remains an important part of Catholic spirituality. It is celebrated on the Saturday after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and the month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The devotion is often associated with Marian consecration, a practice of dedicating oneself to Mary and asking for her intercession and guidance in living a holy life. A life-sized statue of The Immaculate Heart of Mary of Mary is in the church on the left of the Altar to honour her as patroness of the parish. It was donated by the Marist Mission House in Melbourne when it closed. See ourparish.au/parish-history

# SAVE CALVARY HOSPITAL

Update on the imminent legislation to take over Calvary Hospital.

The Canberra Times reported that Prime Minister Anthony Albanese has echoed the ACT Government's line that the takeover

was about expanding public hospital service and not about setting a precedent for governments to force faith-based institutions they don't agree with out of business. He went on to say that "the provision of services by Catholic and other faith-based entities in health, aged care, education, childcare, welfare and other areas is an important part of Australia's social infrastructure." While the Prime Minister's words of support are helpful, they're insufficient to alleviate concerns that religious freedom will continue to be eroded by the states and undefended by the Commonwealth. It is important that the PM hears your concerns. Please take two minutes to send an email to the Prime Minister and ask him to ensure that what is happening to Calvary is not going to happen across Australia. This is a bigger issue than Calvary.

If the ACT Government can do this to a Catholic hospital, then what is to stop them or any other government doing it to a Catholic school or nursing home? Legislation to safeguard against religious discrimination has been promised by both major parties for years but nothing has happened. Please join me in asking the Prime Minister to ensure that other governments around Australia who might feel emboldened by what the ACT Government is doing will not be able to just tear contracts up and remove faith-based operators from public institutions. The Church has been healing, educating and caring for people in this country for more than two centuries. All we want is for governments to let us keep doing it.
