TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

High on the holy mountain in today's Gospel, the true identity of Jesus is fully revealed in His transfiguration. Standing between Moses and Elijah, Jesus is the bridge that joins the Law of Moses to the prophets and psalms. As Moses did, Jesus climbs a mountain and beholds God's glory in a cloud. As Elijah did, He hears God's voice on the mountain. Elijah was prophesied to return as the herald of the Messiah and the new covenant. Jesus is revealed today as that Messiah. By His death and resurrection, He makes a new covenant with creation. God declares Jesus to be His own beloved Son, in whom the Father is well pleased. God here gives us a glimpse of His inner life.

In the cloud of the Holy Spirit, the Father reveals His love for the Son, and invites us to share in that love as His beloved sons and daughters. The last word God speaks from heaven is a command, "Listen to Him". The Word of the Lord should be like a lamp shining in the darkness of our days, as Peter tells us in today's Second Reading. How well are we listening? Do we attend to His word each day? Let us today rededicate ourselves to listening. Let us hear Him as the word of life, the bright morning star of divine life waiting to arise in our hearts. *Extract: Scott Hahn*
