Act today to reject the 'equality' bill From media reports this week, it appears that the NSW Parliament will begin debate on the so-called "equality" bill, a bill that - if passed - would see a number of significant changes to our laws that will have a direct impact on people of faith, as well as vulnerable women and children. More than 13,000 people responded to the NSW parliamentary inquiry into the bill. Of those, more than 85% asked our MPs to reject it entirely. Additionally, the largest online petition to ever be presented to the Legislative Council also asked for it to be voted down. I know many of you signed the petition and made submissions and I am very grateful. Unfortunately, after hearing an overwhelming "no" from their constituents more than once, a full parliamentary inquiry and more than a year of being able to consider its damaging implications, the government refuses to oppose the bill. Under normal circumstances, this private members' bill would have expired months ago but, remarkably, it has remained on the table and now it looks like it will be debated as early as next week. For this reason, it is urgent that you raise your voice today. There is no time to lose. I know we shouldn't have to petition our MPs again to ask them to simply listen to the voters, but it seems we must in these circumstances.

Even if you have already contacted your local MP, I ask you to phone their office today or write to them over the weekend and remind them to reject this bill. https://contactyourmp.org.au/nsw-eq/ The Contact Your MP website provides a simple, step-by-step guide to phoning or writing to your local MP and explaining the concerns about the bill.
